

### **Course Objectives**

This course is for students who are not native speakers of English. It is designed to improve students' overall proficiency in English and to prepare them for college study through the following activities:

- 2. Reading college-level texts
- 3. Taking notes on oral and written materials
- 4. Speaking and pronunciation practice
- 5. Group and individual presentations, including research
- 6. Observing and practicing proper behavior in an American classroom

#### **Course Policies**

**Language:** Since this is a good opportunity for students to use English, it is strongly suggested that you use class time to practice your English skills. This includes both written and spoken language.

Since this is a listening and speaking class you will be required to prepare and deliver oral presentation (5 in total). This will be a great opportunity to practice speaking and to gain confidence speaking in front of a class – something you will need to do in future college courses.

# Final Exam (20%)

Your final exam will test your note-taking and listening skills.
